Michigan Steelhead Fishing Report

Barry Wilkinson and I traveled to Newaygo, Michigan for our annual Spring Steelhead fishing trip. My first trip to Michigan was in 1999 with a fishing buddy from the office. That trip really hooked me on catching steelhead trout and I have been going ever since. I read in a book on Fly Fishing for Steelhead that people have a great passion for pursuing these brutes on light tackle. Steelhead trout are unbelievably strong and can strip line from the best reels as easily as a bird takes flight. We use 8wt rods, leaders are about 14 feet long with 6 lb tippet.



The weather was better than expected with temperatures in the 60's during the day and 40's at night. I think between the two of us we landed and released about 16 steelhead, 4 brown trout, 1 rainbow and about 3 (6 to 8# walleye). The photo is of a 14 lb winter run Steelhead I caught on my second cast, it really started my day off. Kent Inman was supposed to make this trip with us but his work won out over going fishing. I hope he will be able to make this trip next year. If you are interested in traveling to Michigan and trying out their trout fishing or their fall salmon fishing or fishing the Pere Marquette, Muskegon or White River, let me know.

CASTING TIPS AND TRICKS

TENSING AND RELAXING: Regardless of whether you're gripping a single-handed rod or a double-handed rod, there are two things you can do to help you control your casts better: tensing and relaxing.

If you tense your grip slightly as you prepare to stop the rod, it helps to "lock" the muscles and tendons in your arm and wrist. That, in turn, allows you to more easily bring the rod to a halt. One caveat: don't clamp down so hard that you leave fingerprints in the cork. Just a slight squeeze will do the trick.

Pattern: Ginger Variant Scud


Thread: Orange 8/0

Hook: Tiemco 2487 scud size 12-18

Tail & Back: Natural Deer Hair

Rib: Copper Wire.

Abdomen: Ginger variant Waspi Antron dubbing combed out



This is a great fly for the Colorado River at Lee's Ferry and some other tail waters out west, so be sure and put a few in your fly box.

Casting tips and tricks cont'd

Relaxing is just what it sound like: relaxing the muscles in your hand and arm after the cast has been made. Relaxing not only takes tension away from your muscles, but also helps to dampen any after-shocks in the fly rod. Such a damping action will assist in creating smoother line flow through the air. The idea with relaxing isn't to get so loose that the rod falls to the ground. The idea is to just slightly open the fingers that are curled around the rod handle--just enough to remove a bit of tension and to allow the rod a frog's hair of lee-way.

Try a bit of tensing and relaxing the next time you cast, you may find it allows you to be more controlled more easily. And the more control you have, the more precisely you can get the fly to the fish.
