April 18th - Tri-Lakes Fly Fishing Expo.

The Tri-Lakes Fly Fishers of Bolivar, Missouri, will host their 10th annual Expo, which has evolved into the state's largest fly fishing show. The event will be held on Saturday, April 18th from 9 am to 5 pm at the Assembly of God Church activity building located 14 miles north of Springfield on the northbound lane of Highway 13. Breakfast and lunch will be available and there will be informative seminars and programs throughout the day, including "White Bass Fly Fishing" by Michael Kyle, the line class world record holder, "Smallmouth's" by Oklahoma guide Larry Clark, "Belize on a Budget" by Don Greife and Lou Runnals, and "Trout Tactics" by Arkansas guide Ken Richards. In addition, there will be an outdoor casting pool featuring demonstrations and instruction from Misako Ishimura, Captain of the Japanese National Fly Fishing Team, Gene Holland, FFF Certified Casting Instructor, and spey casting by Marc Pinsel of Louisiana's Red Stick Fly Fishers. Thirty-five of the world's best fly tiers demonstrating their skills and techniques will be featured all day. Vendors with fly fishing equipment and art, guides, and outfitters, door prizes, raffles, silent auctions, and a live auction will round out the event. This is the club's only fund raiser for their education and community projects that include fly fishing and fly tying for Bolivar High School's Outdoor Education class, community outdoor education classes, and Project Healing Waters for wounded and disabled veterans from Fort Leonard Wood.


Kid's Derby at Lake Jacomo and the Kid's Derby at Bennett Spring.

Taneycomo Tournament Fishing Experience - 2009.

Kent Inman and I had our first (rookie) experience into the world of tournament trout fishing. We participated in the Lilly's Landing Masters Trout Tournament the weekend of February 28. Our thought was to travel down on Thursday and fish on Friday hoping to find those hot spots. Well, it was very warm when we left Lee's Summit and we were expecting another warm day on Friday. It started out warm but by 2:00 the clouds rolled in, the wind kicked up its heels and because they ran all the water they could muster the fishing was tough. I ended up catching one, and Kent ended up with 3 or 4 for the day. It was back to the room to warm up, head out to dinner and determine how we were going to tackle Taneycomo on Saturday for the tournament. It was just a wonderful surprise to wake up Saturday morning with about 1 inch of snow on the ground and it was still coming down. The wind hadn't started up yet, that's for later on in the day. We headed down from Lilley's Landing to start fishing, and almost immediately Kent landed our first one. The conversation immediately turned to "its going to be a great day". Well that was the last trout we landed all morning. A decision was made to head back to our room, warm up and have some lunch, just maybe it would change our luck. After lunch, the wind was really kicking up its heels, the snow was blowing horizontal to the water, and it was cold. Keeping the boat in position with the water flowing at maximum flow, the wind being a factor, Kent was at his wit's end. Cold, wet fingers make for tying knots really difficult. I finally started to get on a roll catching fish, and with time running out, Kent decided to be the guide and I would try to add more trout to the live well. The tournament rules were that the teams had to be back to the dock by 4:00 pm. Kent loaded up our catch and headed to the weigh in area.



There were 38 teams of two registered for the tournament. There were 7 teams that didn't turn in any fish, 3 teams that turned in just one trout, and a couple of teams that turned in two trout. The winning team won with 8 fish and a total weight of just over 7 lbs. There was a biggest fish contest and the person that won it was with a fish just a little under 1.5lb. We had a wonderful (cold) experience and yes we are signed up for entry into next years tournament. I sure hope its warmer and a whole lot less water. It would be a great time to have some of you in the club join us. By the way, we placed in the middle of the pack.

D. G. Chili Bugger (i.e. Chili Pepper)

Hook Size: #10 – 6

Style / Make: 3XL streamer hook

Thread: 6/0 -8/0 burnt orange

Tying Materials:

Head – copper bead sized to the hook

Weight – 6 turns of lead wire sized to the hook

Tail – copper marabou feather and 3 – 4 strands of copper crystal flash

Body – copper sparkle chenille

Hackle – natural red/brown saddle
